

All Texas Cremation – Summary of Services

The Cremation Process

A signed death certificate is required before other documents for cremation are issued. The medical examiner or Justice of the Peace must issue a permit or consent for cremation after the death certificate is signed. It is the policy of our funeral establishment not to facilitate a cremation without proper consent and permits. **A CREMATION TAKES A MINIMUM OF 10-14 BUSINESS DAYS TO COMPLETE.**

Death Certificates

SECURING A DOCTOR'S SIGNATURE ON A DEATH CERTIFICATE AND OBTAINING COPIES TAKES A MINIMUM OF 25-30 BUSINESS DAYS TO COMPLETE. You will be notified immediately when the certified death certificates are available for you to pick up at the All Texas Business Office. **If you request the certified death certificate copies to be mailed to you, All Texas Cremation Services is not responsible if they are lost in the mail.** It is very important that the Vital Statistics information given during the arrangement conference is correct. **TO ADD OR CORRECT INFORMATION ON THE DEATH CERTIFICATE, IT WILL TAKE A MINIMUM OF SIX MONTHS.** Additional fees are involved if a death certificate is incorrect and an amendment is required. All Texas Cremation will not be held responsible for errors on the death certificate if incorrect or inadequate information is given.
